

**Ordinance No. 11.**

**RELATING TO OFFENSES CONCERNING PUBLIC AND PRIVATE PROPERTY.**

**Injuring Public Property**

Section I. Be it Ordained by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of South Jacksonville, That no person shall, in said village, lead, ride, drive, or place any beast of burden or vehicle on any paved sidewalk or footway, otherwise than going into or out of premises occupied by him or his employees, or shall hitch, or fasten any animal to any public pump or lamp post, or to any ornamental or shade tree growing in any street or sidewalk in said village; and every person so offending shall forfeit and pay to said village not less than three dollars nor more than one hundred dollars for each and every offense.

**Obstructing Sidewalks**

Sec. 2. That every person owning or occupying any building or lot in said village fronting on or adjoining any sidewalk in said village, shall keep or cause the said sidewalk to be kept open and free from all obstructions, barriers and impediments of every description, and the village constable shall cause every such obstruction, barrier or impediment to be immediately removed; such owner or occupant shall forfeit and pay to said village not less than five dollars for every such offense, as well as all expense incurred by the village constable in removing or causing the same to be removed.
