

ORDINANCE NO. 195.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY AND COLLECTION OF A DIRECT ANNUAL TAX OF .08% OF THE FULL FAIR CASH VALUE OF ALL TAXABLE PROPERTY WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE VILLAGE OF SOUTH JACKSONVILLE, TO PROVIDE REVENUE FOR THE PURPOSE OF FIRE PROTECTION, PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 39 OF THE REVISED CITIES AND VILLAGES ACT.

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of South Jacksonville, Morgan County, Illinois, on the 4th day of October, 1950, did pass and enact an ordinance Number 194, which said Ordinance was approved by the Village President on October 4, 1950, and which ordinance did provide for the calling of an election on the question of the adoption by said Village of Article 39 of the Revised Cities and Villages Act, and

WHEREAS, on November 7, 1950, an election was held in and for said Village for the purpose of voting on the following proposition:

Shall the article permitting Cities and Villages containing less than 500,000 inhabitants to levy a tax for Fire Protection purposes, be adopted, and a tax of .08% be levied for such purpose?

and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees did cause to be given at least fifteen (15) days notice of said election by posting notice at least fifteen days before said election in at least three of the most public places in said Village, and at the polling place in said Village, and by publishing notice in the Jacksonville Courier, a newspaper published and of general circulation in said Village; and

WHEREAS, a majority of the votes cast at said election were cast in favor of said proposition, and the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of South Jacksonville is now authorized to levy annually a tax of .08% of the full fair cash value, as equalized or assessed by the Department of Revenue, of all taxable property located within the corporate limits of said

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Village, to provide revenue for the purpose of fire protection in the said Village, and that this tax shall be in addition to and in excess of all taxes authorized by law to be levied and collected in the Village of South Jacksonville, and shall be in addition to and in excess of the amount authorized to be levied for general purposes, as provided by Section 16-1 of the Revised Cities and Villages Act;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED By the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of South Jacksonville, Morgan County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1. That there be, and there is hereby levied upon all of the taxable property within said Village, an annual tax of .08% of the full fair cash value as equalized or assessed by the Department of Revenue, of all taxable property therein for the purpose of fire protection, and that this annual tax shall be in addition to and in excess of all taxes authorized by law to be levied and collected in the Village of South Jacksonville, and shall be in addition to and in excess of the amount authorized to be levied for general purposes as provided by Section 16-1 of the Revised Cities and Villages Act;

SECTION 2. That a certified copy of this ordinance shall be presented to and filed with the County Clerk of Morgan County, Illinois.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE VOTERS OF THE VILLAGE OF SOUTH JACKSONVILLE, MORGAN COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AT A GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 7, 1950, WITHIN THE ENTIRE AREA INCLUDED IN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF SAID VILLAGE, AT WHICH OFFICERS OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS AND THE COUNTY OF MORGAN WILL BE ELECTED, OF THE QUESTION OF THE ADOPTION BY SAID VILLAGE OF ARTICLE 39 OF THE REVISED CITIES AND VILLAGES ACT AS AMENDED BY HOUSE BILL 111 APPROVED APRIL 2, 1949".

WHEREAS, it is deemed necessary to amend an ordinance entitled
