

ORDINANCE NO. 284

An Ordinance Providing for the Election of a Village President, a Village Clerk, Three Trustees of the Village Board of Trustees, and One Trustee of the Village Board of Trustees to Fill an Unexpired Term of Two Years of a Trustee who has resigned.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Statutes of the State of Illinois, the President of the Village of South Jacksonville is to be elected at the next general election; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Statutes of the State of Illinois, the Village Clerk is to be elected at the next general election; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Statutes of the State of Illinois, three Trustees are to be elected at the next General Election for the Board of Trustees of the Village of South Jacksonville, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Statutes of the State of Illinois, one Trustee is to be elected at the next General Election for the Board of Trustees of the Village of South Jacksonville, to fill an unexpired term of two (2) years of a Trustee who has resigned;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of South Jacksonville:

Section 1.: An election shall be held in the Village of South Jacksonville, Morgan County, Illinois, between the hours of 6:00 o'clock A.M., and 6:00 o'clock P.M., on Tuesday, April 18, 1961, for the purpose of electing a President, a Clerk, three members of the Board of Trustees and one member to fill an unexpired term of two years of a member who has resigned, of the Board of Trustees of the Village of South Jacksonville;

Section 2: That for the purpose of said election the entire territory within the corporate limits of South Jacksonville be, and it hereby is, designated as one polling precinct;

Section 3: That the polling place of said precinct shall be at the Village Hall, located on Dewey Drive in said Village;

Section 4: That the Village Clerk is hereby directed to cause at least fifteen, but not more than thirty days notice of such election by publishing a notice in the Jacksonville Courier, a newspaper in general circulation in said Village, there being no newspaper published within said Village, said notice to be in substantially the following form:

NOTICE OF ELECTION.

Village of South Jacksonville, Morgan County, Illinois.

Public notice is hereby given that on Tuesday, April 18, 1961, an election will be held in the Village of South Jacksonville, Morgan County, Illinois, for the purpose electing a Village President, a Village Clerk, three Trustees of the Village Board of Trustees, and one Trustee to serve an unexpired term of two (2) years of a Trustee who has resigned from the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of South Jacksonville, Illinois. The Village Hall on Dewey Drive in the Village of South Jacksonville is the polling place of said election.

The polls at said election will be open at 6:00 o'clock in the forenoon and will be closed at 6:00 o'clock in the afternoon on said day. All persons qualified to vote at General Municipal elections are entitled to vote.

Section 6: That the Village Clerk be, and hereby is directed to cause the printing of the ballots and the obtaining of necessary supplies to conduct said election and further to publish a sample ballot pursuant to law prior to said date of election.

Section 7. That this ordinance be in full force immediately upon its passage and approval.
