Ordinance No. 103.

Annual Appropriation Ordinance for the
fiscal year beginning with the third Tuesday in
April A.D. 1933 and ending with the Monday last
preceding the third Tuesday in April A.D. 1934.

Be it ordained by the President and Board of
Trustees of the Village of Joville Jacksonville, Illinois,

Section 1

that there be and there be is appropriated for the
fiscal year beginning with the third Tuesday in April

the third Tuesday in April 1934, for the use of the
Village of Joville Jacksonville Illinois, the sum
of Ninety Thousand Dollars, for the purposes and
in the amounts hereinafter set forth.

trustee there made a motion that the annual appropriation ordinance no 103, as presented and read be passed and approved. member Brewster seconded the motion. President McCarley put the motion and the clerk called the roll, which was as follows: Thaine yes, Ayre yes, Brewster yes, Schidman yes, Caldwell yes, member Hackett absent.

An ordinance from P. E. Grimm, in which he asked for a franchise to construct and install gas mains through the village for the installation of natural gas to serve here for cooking and heating purposes. specifying a price and other stipulations, and agreement was read before the members by village attorney, W. E. Thomson for their consideration and passage. The ordinance quite lengthy covered many points to be considered. Mr Grimm was present at the meeting and he explained to the members in detail the significance of the ordinance. Considerable discussion took place, the members asking many questions and in return being answered by Mr Grimm. Member Caldwell made a motion that the gas ordinance as presented and read be passed and
